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
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
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
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Influenza vaccination is for everyone



NIP funded populations across life



84.1% want to get a flu vaccine

60.5% actually got a flu vaccine 2024

Can we do better?

NOTES

- · Pharmacies are accessible with convenient hours and locations
- Patients can book online, though bookings aren't always required
- Many West Australians visit pharmacies when well, offering an opportunity to remind them to vaccinate or provide vaccinations on the spot
- · Pharmacists frequently provide medicines information
- Anecdotally, some patients worry that asking vaccination questions may make them seem 'antivax', even if they are just seeking clarification
- Pharmacists feel confident in answering vaccination questions and provide resources to help
- They also explain what to expect after vaccination and how to manage any side effects
- West Australians can attend the pharmacy for vaccinations from 5 years and up
- The scope of vaccinations pharmacists can provide has rapidly expanded over the past 12 months
- Over time, West Australians will become more familiar with which vaccines are available from pharmacies

Can we do better?

- Pharmacists are developing strategies for opportunistic vaccination.
- Some parents prefer to have the whole family vaccinated for flu at the same time, but this isn't always possible due to illness or children being under 5.
- Pharmacists are becoming more comfortable with coadministration of vaccines, with increased focus on this approach.
- Checklists and tools from WA Health would be valuable, as resources like the NCIRS and Australian Immunisation Handbook can be time-consuming to review.
- Pharmacists are encouraged to book future vaccinations and send reminders.
- It's important to review missing vaccinations at every event.
- Anecdotal feedback suggests patients are still unaware of which vaccines can be provided by pharmacists.
