



Context

- Focus: CaLD communities in rural & remote regions of WA
 - Migrants from the Asia-Pacific region → 46.3% of total living with hep B in Australia
 - Remote & very remote areas → Hep B rates are 3x national average
- Challenge: Screening & Vaccination rates remain low in these populations
- Needs:
 - Targeted education & outreach
 - Access to culturally appropriate services

- Aim: Health promotion & education targeting CaLD communities in rural & remote WA
- Partnership with WACHS & other local stakeholders
- Status: in planning & consultation stages
